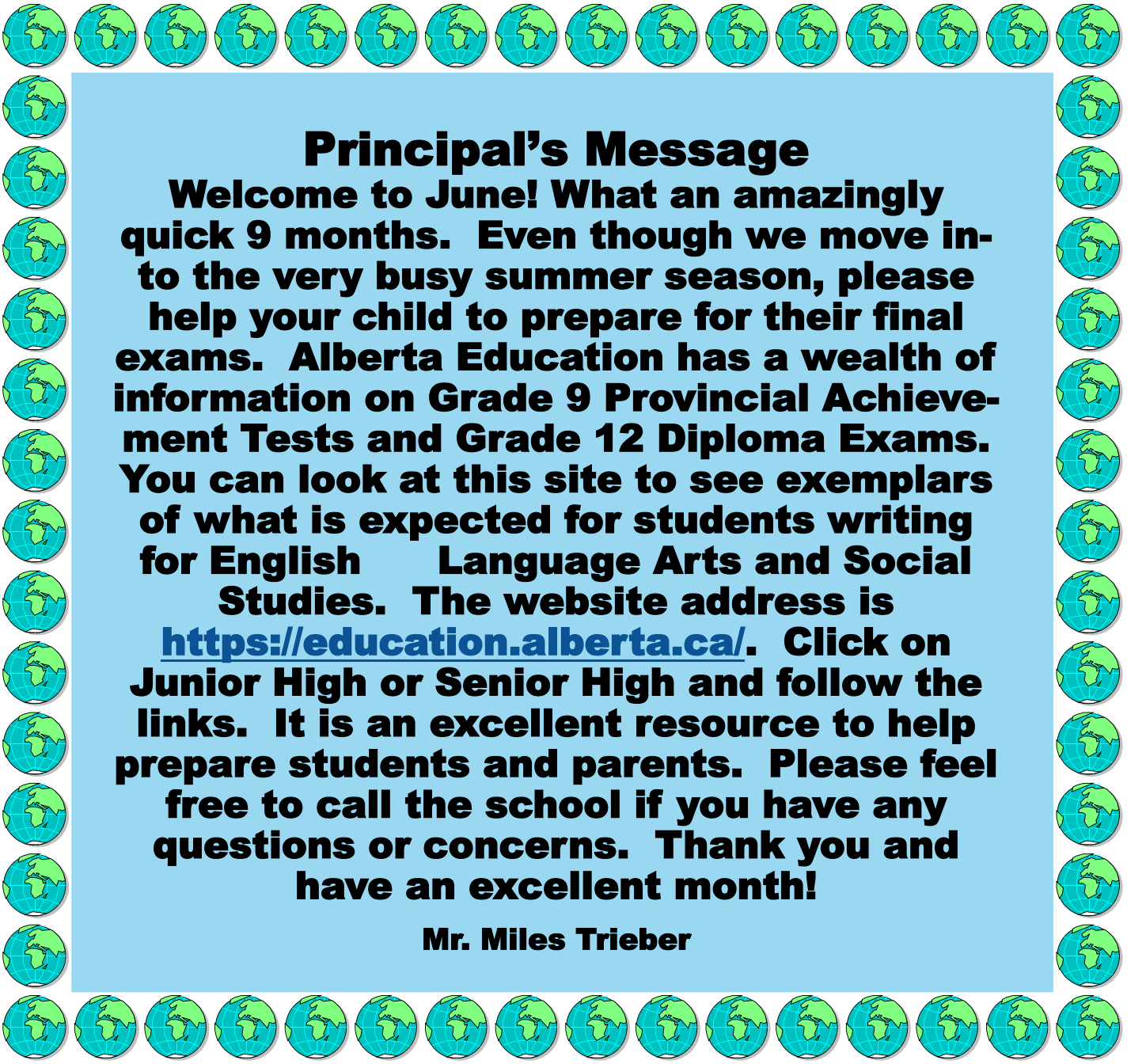

- The course is optional but if completed could earn you 6 high school credits.

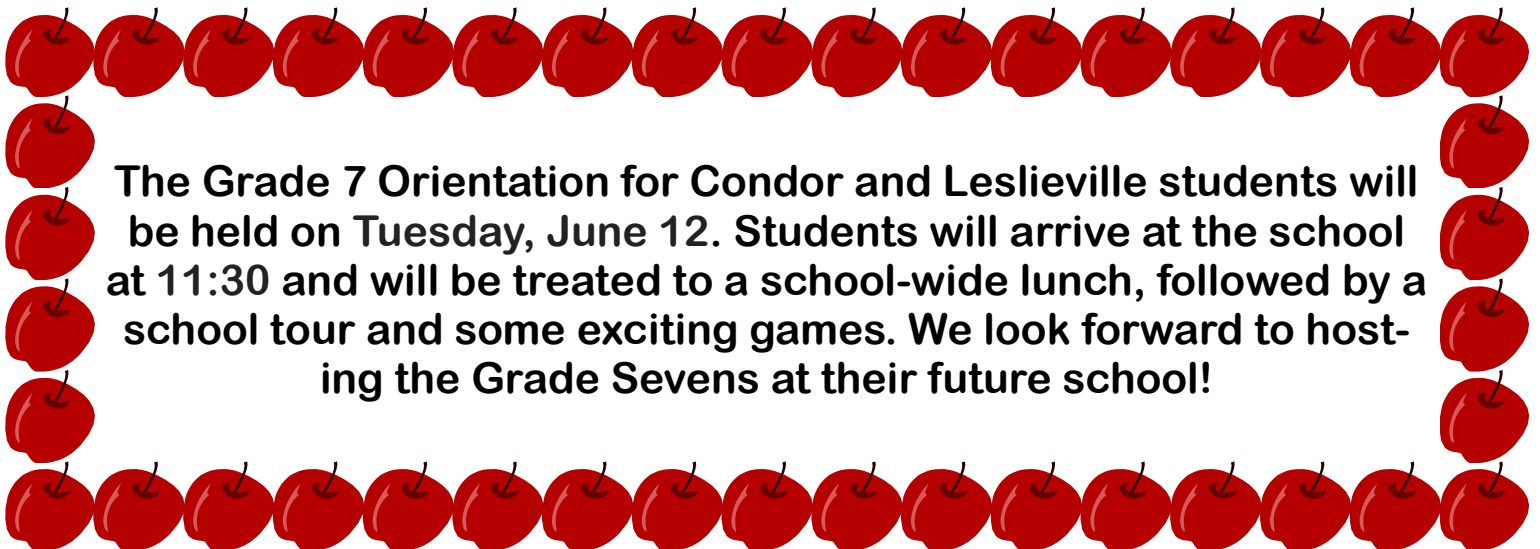

CAREER EDUCATION NOTES

- We have arranged, as a service to our students, to have 6S Safety come to the school on May 31 to do an H2S course. They are charging \$110 for the course which is much less than their usual fee.
- Mr. Seim will be offering another First Aid course on June 26 and 27. The cost will be \$50. Since there are only 10 spots available, you will need to register as soon as possible to ensure you are able to take the course.
- Grade 12 students who are attending post-secondary will be able to apply for **student loans** and the **Rutherford Scholarship** only after the 2018/2019 application forms are available. 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Career Corner

Students that are headed into grade 11 and 12 are eligible receive credit by working. Both paid and volunteer positions are acceptable. To receive credits, students must have their employer fill in a Work Experience Contract which is also signed by the guardian and student. Once the contract is back at the school, students can start counting their hours towards credits.

Students receive a credit for every 25 hours of work they complete, but they must put in a minimum of 125 hours with one employer. Depending on the number of hours worked, students can receive up to 30 high school credits in Work Experience, 10 credits per grade level.

It is up to the student/employer to keep track of hours which have to be handed into the school. This can be in the form of a signed calendar or pay stubs.

Once the contract is handed in, a quick safety assessment is completed on site. Employer evaluations determine students marks.

The DTHS office will no longer automatically print receipts for fee payments. If you require a receipt, please contact the school office and we will be happy to send one home with your child.

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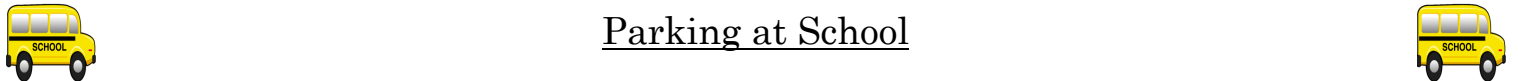


DRESS CODE REMINDER – Students are expected to:

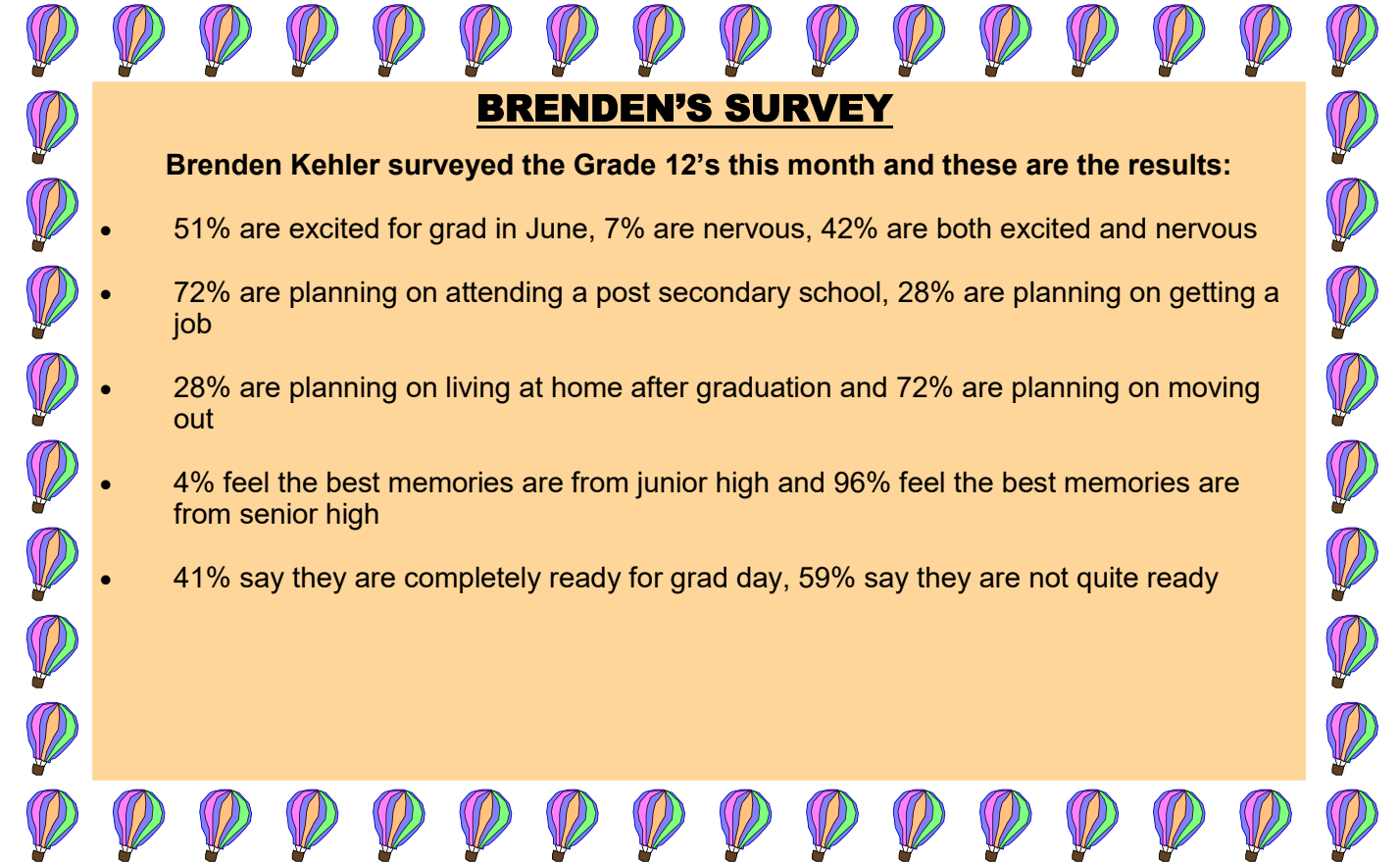

BRENDEN'S SURVEY

Brenden Kehler surveyed the Grade 12's this month and these are the results:

- 51% are excited for grad in June, 7% are nervous, 42% are both excited and nervous
- 72% are planning on attending a post secondary school, 28% are planning on getting a job
- 28% are planning on living at home after graduation and 72% are planning on moving out
- 4% feel the best memories are from junior high and 96% feel the best memories are from senior high
