## **Principal's Message**

Another exciting year of learning is underway at David Thompson High School. DTHS is continuing on the journey of High School Re-Design and introducing some of the concepts to the Grade 8 and 9 students. The goal of High School Re-Design is to allow high school students to personalize and take responsibility for their education. DTHS in communication with the parents/guardians are here to help guide students in their decision making. High school students are also receiving 35 minutes of Extended Learning Time each day. The ELT is curriculum time and not spares for students. The expectation for students is that they are in a classroom getting extra help, completing late assignments or missed exams, studying, completing a distance learning course, or reading. One of the main goals of ELT is that students will learn to prioritize and be able to make a responsible decision for their education. The students in Grade 8 and 9 receive one period of ELT on Tuesdays. Hopefully this will help them start the process of responsible decision making in high school. We will also continue on with our focus on literacy as the Grade 8 and 9 students will

continue their reading period once a week. DTHS places great value on getting students into the community for learning and educational experiences through field trips, volunteer opportunities, and work experience. We see the connection with the community as a vital piece in the students' education. The Grade 8s and 9s have attended their camp trips and Grade 10s have been out golfing. We have a number of students involved in our off-campus programs in work experience and green certificate. ## **Distance Education News**



It is impossible for a small school such as David Thompson to offer all topics that interest every student. The solution is Distance Education courses. Students start the process by talking to Mr. Trieber and Mrs. Thompson. Once approved, a \$100 completion deposit is given to the office and the course is ordered. Students are enrolled and have their course in approximately 24 hours. Some courses have the option of print and/or online. Others are online only.

Grade 10 and 11 students will work on these courses in a supervised classroom. The average time it takes to complete a credit is 25 hours. The amount of credits a student takes reflects the amount of credits they would have earned in the class that they opted out of. One period a day is equal to 3 credits a semester.

Completed assignments should be handed in at the Career Office. If I am not in the office, please email me to tell me you have handed in an assignment for marking: <u>linda.tomlinson@wrsd.ca</u>. Assignments are usually marked within a few days. Completed modules are stored in the Library with Mrs. Williamson. They are returned to students before exams to study.
