• Completion of CTR 3310 Career Planning Portfolio and presentation. Portfolios are due Jan. 26th and the presentation date will be Feb. 16th, 2017.

- A mark of 50% must be maintained in all courses required for a high school diploma as of June 15th.
 - A minimum of four 30 level courses and 115 credits.
 - Students enrolled in Distance Education courses must have completed 4/5 of all their Distance Education courses required for graduation by May 1st to be eligible.
 - All Distance Education courses must be handed in by the last day of classes.

Those students who still have courses to complete, need to do so ASAP to make their workload in the new semester more manageable. David Thompson being a small school, uses distance education courses to offer a wider range of classes. That being said, no school in Alberta, no matter the size, can offer all the courses available through ADLC.

Students who are successful with Distance Education are ones that are self-motivated to work on the course daily, the same as an in-class course. Students who wish to take Distance Education classes in semester two need to discuss it with Mr. Trieber and Mrs. Thompson. A one hundred dollar completion deposit is also required.

Career Corner - February 2017

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<u>Green Certificate:</u> The Green Certificate Program is a course that is run through Olds College giving students an opportunity to learn hands-on farming techniques. There are ten different agricultural based streams: Cow/Calf, Dairy, Field Crop, Sheep, Swine, Beekeeper, Equine, Feedlot and Greenhouse Production. Each stream is divided into three sections. Students work with a mentor learning all aspects of the industry. When they feel they have mastered a section they sign up for an oral exam at Olds College.

The next testing dates are February 22 and 23 with Dairy taking place in Lacombe on February 23. Another opportunity to test takes place May 23 and 24 with Dairy on the 25th. Green Certificates are recognized in the agricultural community throughout Canada.

Students can sign up for the Green Certificate at any time. Forms are available through the Career Office. A two hundred dollar completion deposit is needed before students are registered.

<u>Work Experience</u>: Students who are working, for an employer or at home, have the ability to gain credits through Work Experience. Before counting hours, students need to get the approval of their employer and return a signed contract to the school. Students then keep track of their hours through pay stubs or by written sheets and turn them into the Career Center. For every 25 hours worked the students are eligible for 1 credit with the minimum being 125 hours.
